Dear Parents/Carers

I would like to start by thanking all parents for their supportive response to my request in the last newsletter, asking all adults while on site to wear a face mask. Thank you for your ongoing support.

I would also like to welcome our Reception pupils who started school this week. We are looking forward to welcoming children in Nursery next week. I would like to remind everyone of the expectations when entering the site, as we now have even more parents entering the school to drop and collect pupils.

Reception and Nursery places available - including 30 hours free

We have spaces available in our Reception and Nursery classes. The places available in Nursery are part time and full time. Children born between 01/09/2016 – 31/08/2017 are entitled to 15 hours free nursery care each week. Some parents are entitled to 30 hours free care for their children. Please tell family and friends who might be interested.



Parking

As a result of staggered start and collection times, along with different drop off and pick up points for children, we are finding that some parents are parking in a way that is UNSAFE and INCONSIDERATE to our neighbours. Can I ask that parents do not park in the car park by Summer House or on the double yellow lines in front of Summer House. These spaces are reserved for the visitors of Summer House and for emergency vehicle access. Please be considerate to our neighbours as we have made changes to keep our community safe but we don't want these changes to impact on our local wider community. We have also had complaints from residents on Tolpits Lane, parents have been parking across drop kerbs and on the double yellow lines.

Please ensure your child wears their Holywell Primary School PE kit to school, with no variations of this. Parents can send their children in with black tracksuit bottoms on PE days, these are to be worn with their PE kits and a school jumper.

3:40 pm – Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2)


4:00 pm - Lower Key Stage 2 (Year 3 and Year 4)

RRS - Assessment



On Thursday 17th September 2020 the school will be assessed to achieve Rights Respecting school status - Silver award. The work for this award was completed before the COVID-19 lockdown, but we feel confident that the evidence that we will put forward plus the interviews that will take place on the day with staff and pupils, will put us in a good position.

Reception Class - Times

Snack for Early Years and Key Stage 1



When to self-isolate:

If you have any of the symptoms (a new continuous cough, a high temperature (37.8 degrees or more) suggestive of COVID-19.

If you have tested positive for COVID-19.

If you have a household contact with symptoms or who has tested positive for COVID-19.

If you have identified as a contact via Test and Trace or a risk assessment.

How long should you self-isolate for:

If you tested positive you need to self-isolate for 10 days from the start of the symptoms.

If you have a prolonged raised temperature you need to continue to self-isolate beyond 10 days until 48 hours after your last raised temperature.

If you are a household contact of someone with symptoms or someone with a positive test you need to self-isolate for 14 days even if you had a negative test.

If you are a workplace or social contact you need to self-isolate for 14 days even if you had a negative test.

We trust that parents will strictly follow travel guidance and adhere to self-isolation rules for countries that they have visited.

Please keep us up to date with clear symptoms of pupils who are ill and let us know if you suspect COVID-19 or had a test so that we can enforce these policies correctly.
