Dear Parents/Carers


It has been another extraordinary year with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic prevalent.



Covid-19 Testing - Lateral Flow Test and PCR Test Parents are reminded that if their child shows symptoms of Coronavirus that they need to book a PCR Test, as set out in government guidance.

Using a Lateral Flow Test to rule out Coronavirus is not sufficient because these tests work differently.

The most accurate way to establish if someone has Coronavirus is through using a PCR Test. We kindly ask you always inform the school of the results please.

Coronavirus

We will keep our protocols and safeguarding the same as before half term and ask that parents continue to support us in staying safe.

Parents are reminded about Public Health England advice -

Pupils, staff and other adults must not come into school if:

- They have one or more COVID-19 symptoms
- A member of their household (including someone in their support bubble or childcare bubble, if they have one) has COVID-19 symptoms
- They are legally required to quarantine, having recently visited countries outside the Common Travel Area
- They have had a positive test
- Have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for COVID-19

In these circumstances

They must immediately cease to attend school and not attend for at least 10 days from the day after:

- The start of their symptoms
- The test date if they did not have any symptoms but have had a positive PCR Test. As set out in government guidelines, a Lateral Flow test is not suitable for primary aged children.

We must follow this process to ensure everyone's safety on site.
