## **Black History Month**

Chestnut class, through their class assembly, introduced Black History month to the rest of the school a few weeks ago. Usually we would have theatre groups coming into school, but as we are still strict about visitors entering the building, we will do things slightly differently this year. The two weeks after half term is our usual assessment weeks, where we do our 'Take One Book' unit.



The book that we will be focussing on this year is called 'Coming to England'. This book is written by Floella Benjamin and tells her story of migrating to England from Trinidad in 1960. In addition to the writing that pupils will be doing linked to the book, we will be designing some additional activities that children can complete linked to Black History month.

Half term is from Monday 26th October 2020 until Friday 30th October 2020 when school will be closed. School will close at normal times on Friday 23rd October 2020.
