Coronavirus Information

Thank you to all parents for wearing your masks when entering the premises this week. It is reassuring to know that parents are supporting us in keeping everyone safe.

I would also like to thank parents for their patience moving around the site and following the new routines. On the whole, things have been running fairly smoothly.

Pupils, staff and other adults must not come into school if:

- they have one or more coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms
- a member of their household (including someone in their support bubble or childcare bubble, if they have one) has coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms
- they are required to quarantine having recently visited countries outside the Common Travel Area
- they have had a positive test

They must immediately cease to attend school and not return for at least 10 days from the day after:

- the start of their symptoms
- the test date if they did not have any symptoms but have had a positive test (whether this was a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) or Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.

If anyone in school develops a new and continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia),

- they must go home to begin isolation the isolation period includes the day the symptoms started and the next 10 full days
- follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection
- arrange to have a test as soon as possible to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)















Routines and procedures

I have been impressed with the resilience the children have shown since the school fully opened two weeks ago. You will have noticed that teachers have started setting homework and daily reading for pupils again.

We are determined to close the gap created as a result of the two school closures.

During the past few weeks, and continuing into next week, we are again getting a baseline for pupils attainment through informal assessments. This will help guide our teaching for the summer term and ensure that -

- We focus on areas of weakness identified
- Continue to deliver a broad balanced curriculum
- · Speed up any progress where needed

Winter Grant – Free School Meal Vouchers

Parents of pupils who are entitled to Free School Meals will receive their Easter holiday and May half term vouchers, via Edenred, shortly. Sports Clubs after Easter

We have agreed to some after school sports club provision to be delivered by Watford Football Club CSE Trust. Initially, this will be rolled out to two year groups. After the previous lockdown, the uptake of clubs was understandably very low and we need to ensure we get value for money.



A separate letter will be sent out to parents about the Tag Rugby club for Year 5 and the Football club for Year 6. All coaches from Watford CSE are DBS checked and will follow the latest COVID-19 guidelines issued by the government. Many parents will be aware community sport can resume from 29th March 2021.
