### **Transition Day**

As we are coming to the close of the 2021 - 2022 academic year, we are doing lots of work to prepare pupils for their onward journeys. Year 6 pupils are getting many visits from the allocated secondary schools and we are providing some transition workshops. We are also visiting some other Early Years settings to help us get ready for the new pupils who will be joining us in Nursery and Reception.

Transition Day will be on Thursday 14th July. Year 6 pupils will visit their secondary schools and all pupils in school will meet their new classmates and teachers for the 2022 - 2023 academic year. We will inform you in advance of the teachers who will be allocated to each year group and class.

### **Relationship Education**

- Year 1- Designing and making soft bags for toys.
- Year 2- Designing and making a glove puppet.
- Year 3- Designing and making gift boxes using 3D nets.
- Year 4- Designing and making party boxes to organise a birthday.
- Year 5- Designing and making alarm systems for the school shed.
- Year 6- Designing and making a lighting system.

Pupils learnt how to identify the qualities of making something, planning and then making a product. Once their products were made, they reviewed them against the qualities they have identified at the start of the process. Good consideration is always given for the audience of the product.

# UNICEF ARTICLE OF THE WEEK ARTICLE 22- Refugee children Article 10- Family Reunification



## LINKED UNCRC ARTICLES

This week's activities link to the following articles:

### Article 22 (refugee children)

If a child is seeking refuge or has refugee status, governments must provide them with appropriate protection and assistance to help them enjoy all the rights in the Convention. Governments must help refugee children who are separated from their parents to be reunited with them.

#### Article 10 (family reunification)

Governments must respond quickly and sympathetically if a child or their parents apply to live together in the same country. If a child's parents live apart in different countries, the child has a right to visit and keep in contact with both of them.




# What events may lead to children and their families becoming refugees?

- <u>Natural disaster e.g. flood, hurricane,</u> <u>earthquake, tsunami, volcanic activity,</u> <u>snow storm, bushfire and others</u>
- Drought, famine lack of food and water
- War and conflict
- <u>Climate change changes in weather</u> <u>affect access to food, water and</u> <u>education</u>
- <u>Discrimination: racism, religious beliefs;</u> <u>gender; homophobia; nationality</u> <u>(xenophobia); political beliefs</u>
- <u>Civil unrest in a country making people</u> <u>feel unsafe</u>
- Poverty or loss of income
- Family disputes or problems
