Reporting positive cases during the Easter Break

We will continue to keep track of positive cases of Coronavirus until Thursday 1 April 2021 for pupils and staff. This means any staff and pupils who test positive for Coronavirus between now and 1st April 2021 and those who are considered to be in close proximity should self-isolate as per current guidance.

We therefore ask that parents let us know via admin@holywell.herts.sch.uk when they or their children test positive for coronavirus. When informing us please state the

- Name
- class of the child
- When they started to show symptoms
- When they were tested
- When they received their result.

This information will help us to determine the next actions to take to stop the spread of the virus.

Throughout the break, staff will continue to do twice weekly lateral flow tests which is another layer of protection to our school community.

Coronavirus Information on Return to School

When we return to school after the Easter break we will continue to keep up our strict procedures ensure we keep safe. We will review these after a few weeks in, depending how cases of Coronavirus develop. We therefore ask that

- Parents continue to wear face coverings when entering the premises.
- Keep to our dropping off and collection procedures and not gather in groups, but social distance from each other.

Even though parents might gather outside in groups of 6 from Monday, we want to ensure that any spike in cases over the Easter break does not affect our immediate community including parents, pupils and staff.

Pupils, staff and other adults are reminded not to come into the school if:

- they have one or more coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms
- a member of their household (including someone in their support bubble or childcare bubble if they have one) has coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms
- they are required to quarantine having recently visited countries outside the Common Travel
 Area
- they have had a positive test

They must immediately cease to attend and not attend for at least 10 days from the day after:


- the start of their symptoms
- the test date if they did not have any symptoms but have had a positive test (whether this was a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) or Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.

If anyone in school develops a new and continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia),

- they must go home to begin isolation the isolation period includes the day the symptoms started and the next 10 full days
- follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection
- arrange to have a test as soon as possible to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

We will continue with the Breakfast and After School Club after the Easter holiday. Any parent wishing to use the club are asked to contact the school office. The Breakfast Club starts from 7:30 am each morning and the After School Club runs until 5:30 pm in the afternoon.


