### Assessments

When we return to school after the half term, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils will be completing their phonics screening assessments and during the second week Years 3, 4 and 5 will be completing their end of year assessments.

### **Earth Day**

This week, we had representatives from Veolia (organised by the Watford Borough Council) who presented to the children across the school, about Earth Day. The children learnt about recycling and sustainability and how we can reduce waste in our homes.

### Term Dates 2022 - 2023

There has been a slight amendment to the term dates for the next academic year 2022 - 2023. Instead of school starting on Monday 5th September 2022, school will now restart for pupils on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September. This will give us an extra day of staff training, which we will use for phonics training.















### **Queen's Platinum Jubilee**

Today we had a lovely assembly presented by Sycamore class about the Queen's Jubilee. This week the children have been learning about the last 7 decades of Queen Elizabeth's reign. We are looking forward to our picnic this afternoon.



### **Y5 Workshops**

We had a visit this week from Entertaining Science – Circus Skills. The children really enjoyed the workshops and were asked to write a small piece for our newsletter.

**Kayla's on the assembly:-** "Never in my life, have I seen something educational be converted into maximum fun! My boring body had a gust of energy and after my ears touched his commercial speech. I almost froze hearing our kind-hearted teacher (Miss Hampton) telling us we were going to have a marvellous well-spent hour with him. Then after our scrumptious lunch another hour! The first thing the scientist did in his memorable assembly was talk about the main forces we learnt in Science as a class such as air resistance, pull, push, twist and so on. Most of the assembly was him doing some impossible tricks with peacock feathers, juggling and a unicycle! "

**Maddison's on the workshop:-** "Mysteriously we had a powerful peacock feather activity. At the start it was really hard to balance it (on the palm of your hand) but then I did it on my elbow (ta daa)! It felt like magic to me! But obviously Dr Ken did it way better than me! We learnt how this was caused by a push and pull force."

**Amelia on the workshop:-** "As soon as we did the afternoon registration we headed down to the infant hall to start our workshop. First thing first, he chose me as the volunteer. I stood at the front and put my hand in an 'L' shape. Unexpectedly he told me he was going to drop a piece of paper into my finders to see how good my reactions were."
