Google Classroom – Live Lessons

I am pleased to inform parents that engagement in live lessons and submitting work has significantly increased during this past week. I am eagerly awaiting feedback from teachers about the week, but I know that from visiting the live lessons, many more pupils are attending live lessons and actively taking part. In many of the live lessons this week we had 100% attendance. We would like to remind parents that we think of remote learning as we do of school learning. Learning is not optional, we expect all pupils to fully participate. This means they need to join live lessons and submit the work that is allocated by the class teacher. If you need any support for your child please let us know.



We are continuing to check in with families who are not engaging with on line learning. This week, we had a few more requests from parents for devices. We now plan to issue some of our school laptops to families. I am sure you will have heard on the news that schools will not reopen until at least Monday 8th March 2021. We want all children to continue to learn, and ask you to please contact us if you need help with learning, food, signposting or anything else. We are here for everyone.

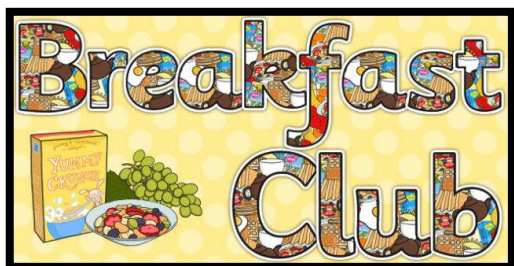
Reception Class - Live Lessons

Breakfast and After School Club

We have successfully completed our first week of breakfast and after school club provision.

If your child currently has a school place during the restricted attendance then you can make use of our breakfast and afterschool club.



I would like to remind parents that children should not come into school if they are required to stay at home because they:

- **are ill with virus symptoms**
- **have tested positive, even if asymptomatic**
- **have been advised by NHS Test and Trace to do so**
- **are household members of a positive case, even if that case is asymptomatic**
- **are required to self-isolate for travel-related reasons**

I must stress to parents that taking these steps is absolutely not negotiable. By not following this advice parents are putting the whole school community at risk. We are working extremely hard to deliver learning, support families on many levels whilst keeping ourselves and our pupils safe within school.

The current guidance and restrictions are a lawful requirement and each and every one also has a moral obligation to adhere to these restrictions without exception.

Monday Assembly

On Monday 25th January 2021, during our Key Stage 2 assembly, we were joined by Mr Dean Russell, the Conservative MP for Watford. He had a good Q&A session with pupils about their online learning and how they are finding learning during the lockdown. Pupils were very good at asking questions to Mr Russell, it was interesting to hear how pupils and families are dealing with remote learning.

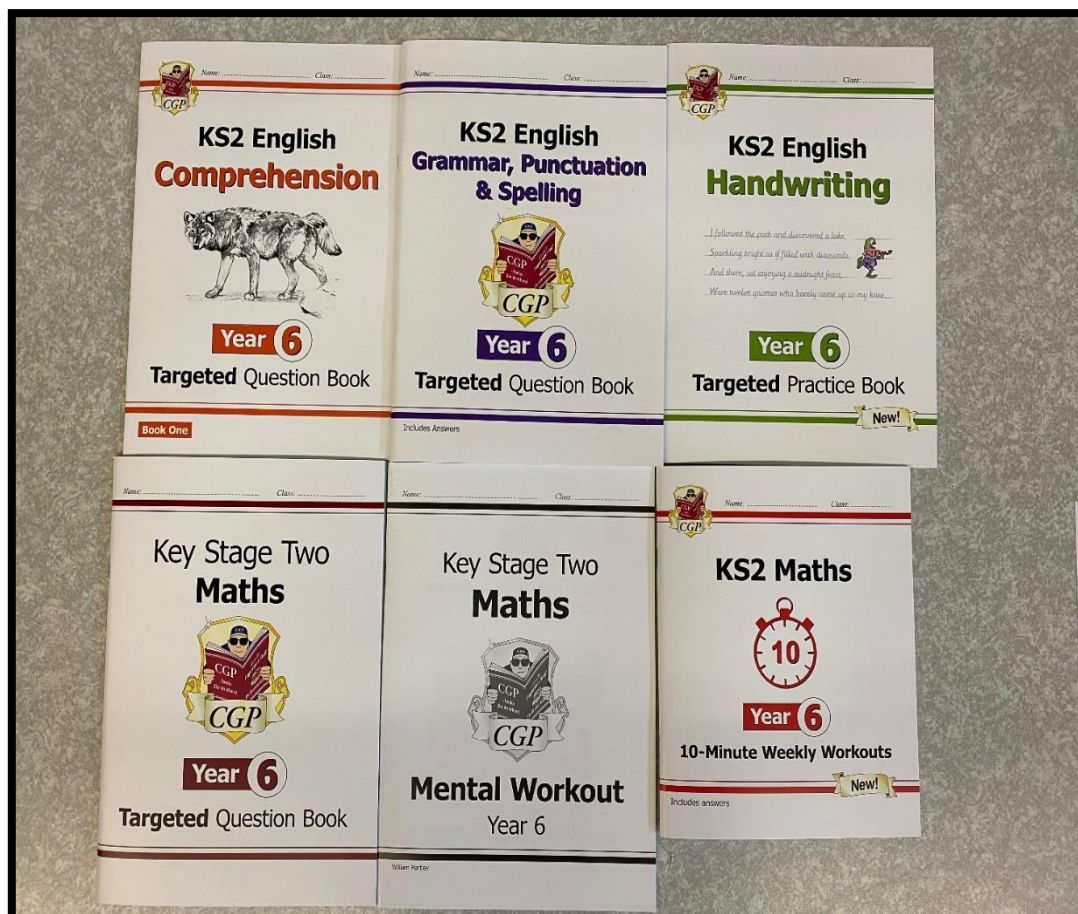

We are capping the number of children in class, as social distancing is most effective. New applications will be considered on a case by case basis. We have to take a tough stance at present as COVID-19 cases and deaths are still very high, particularly in the Watford, Holywell area.

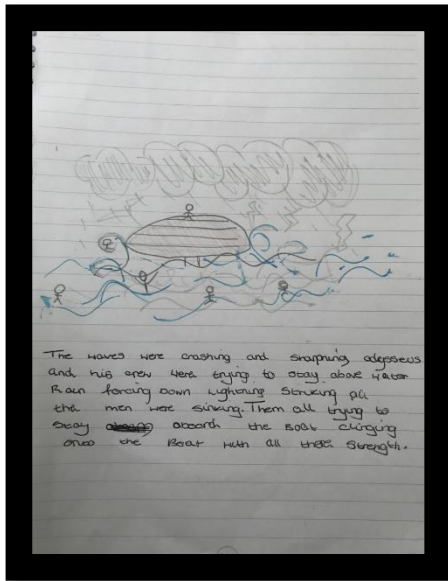

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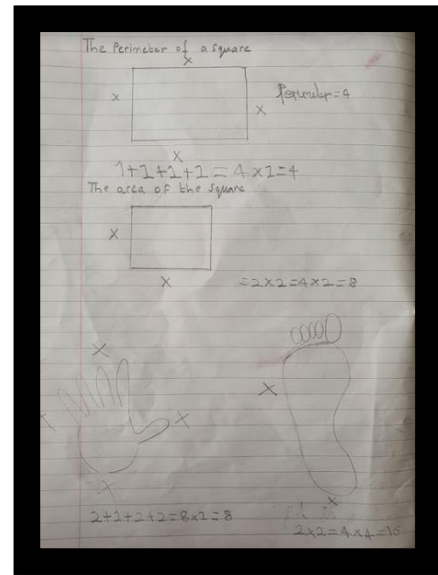




Article 2- No Discrimination
