From Tuesday 18th April 2023, the cost of a school meal will increase to £2.80 per meal per child. We hope we will not have to increase the cost again in the near future. We are very pleased that we have managed not to increase this cost for quite a few years.

A Message from the Watford Borough Council

From May 2023, the law requires voters to present an approved photo ID when voting in person at their polling station. The approved ID, such as your photo driving licence or passport, will be accepted even if they have expired, as long as they show a true likeness to the holder. Those without an acceptable form of ID can apply for a free 'Voter Authority Certificate' (VAC) until the deadline on 25 April 2023. If you miss this date, you can still apply but your VAC won't be ready for you to use at the 4 May 2023 local elections. If residents have any questions or require help applying for their free Voter Authority Certificate (VAC), direct them to our Elections Team (elections@watford.gov.uk) who will be able to assist them.
