Key Workers During The Easter Break

A text message went out yesterday morning to remind Key Workers who are required to work that they must inform the office if they need care for their children over the next two weeks. At this point in time we have timetabled staff and offer care on all days except the bank holidays. We can however consider the bank holidays if there is a big enough demand from parents.



We will not be able to provide children of Key Workers attending school with a lunch, they will need to bring in their own packed lunch.

Key Workers After The Easter break

We are obviously awaiting the government review of the current arrangements regarding social distancing and school closures but will continue to offer care to Key Workers after the Easter holiday should the school remain closed. If you have completed a form previously we will assume you will continue to bring your child. However all parents considering bringing their child after Easter must complete a form if they have not already done so. Please email the school office if you require a form.

Free School Meals moving forward

Over the last two weeks we have offered packed lunches to pupils who are entitled to free school meals. We have since made arrangements with Tesco and can now offer pupils who are entitled to a free school meal a £15 Tesco voucher each week. A separate letter will go out to these families today, Friday 3rd April 2020, telling them how to collect their vouchers from school on Monday 20th April 2020. To avoid crowds of people on the school site and meet our social distancing requirements we will stagger parents coming into school so please read the letter carefully. Now that the government has set up their system we will register and offer parents those voucher from Monday 4th May 2020, assuming school is still closed at that time.
