Managing Bubble Sizes


We have been contacted by a few parents who have requested that their children come back to school. As coronavirus cases in Holywell and the surrounding area are still very high, we do not feel we can make our bubble sizes much bigger. We know many parents have reasons to ask for their children to come back, but currently we will only consider cases where there is an absolute necessity. These reasons include – if parents are not able to continue to manage their children's learning, parents qualify as a critical worker or the child comes under the vulnerable child category.

We will continue to only take new pupils into school on a Monday. This is so we can manage and maintain social distancing and stop the mixing of pupils in school. We must keep staff and pupils, who are in school, safe. Please contact the school office if you qualify under any of the categories listed above. New applications will be considered on a case by case basis. We have to take a

tough stance at present as COVID-19 cases and deaths are still very high, particularly in the Watford, Holywell area.

Breakfast and After School Club

We have successfully completed our second week of Breakfast and After School club provision. I would like to remind parents that children should not come into school if they are required to stay at home because they:
