Curriculum map Summer 2019 – Year Nursery

| Subject Area | Content |
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| Literacy | Communication and language: Beginning to be aware of the way that stories are structures. Able to say what has happened and what may happen next. Reading and writing: Joins in with repeated refrains & anticipates key events in stories & rhymes. Recognises and begins to write their own name. Can give the phonetic sounds at the beginning of some words. Phonic books will be changed every Monday and Library books will contilnue to be given out and changed every Friday. |
| Maths | Numbers: Recites numbers in order to 10 and then to 20. Beginning to write numbers. Knows that numbers identify how many objects are in a set and mostly matches numeral and quantity correctly. Is aware of numbers that are important to them- family ages, house numbers etc. Shapes, space and measure: Can recognise and name 2D shapes. |
| Knowledge and understanding of the world | People and Communities: Shows interest in the lives of people who are familiar to them. The World: Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time. Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world. Technology: |

| Music | Voices: Increasing children's confidence to use their voice and independent singing. |
| PE | Can stand momentarily on one foot when shown Can catch a large ball Holds pencil between thumb and two fingers, no longer using a whole hand grip. Can copy some letters correctly e.g. letters for their name. Understand that equipment and tools have to be used safely. Dresses independently e.g. puts on jackets and jumpers; pulls up zip. |
| PSHE | Is more outgoing towards unfamiliar people and more confident in new social situations Is aware of their own feelings and know that some actions and words can hurt others feelings Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas, e.g. building up a role-play activity with other children. Enjoys the responsibility of carrying out small tasks. Begins to accept the needs of others & can take turns & share resources sometimes with support from an adult. Developing own ways to self-regulate their behaviour. |
