Dear Parents or Guardians,

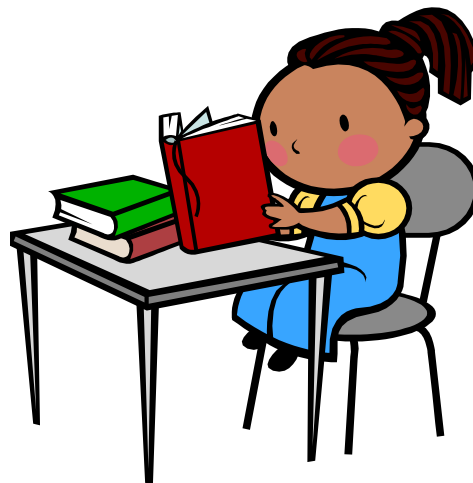

Curriculum

As is required by law, we follow the National Curriculum, which provides the children with the opportunity to fulfil their individual potential.

The children will often be grouped according to ability for their Guided Reading, Phonics, English and Numeracy sessions to help them achieve their targets. This is to ensure that each child's needs are met.

Themes for the whole school area:

Autumn Term – Great Britain

Spring Term - International

Summer Term – Local area



Attendance and Punctuality:

Please ensure that your child is in the playground and lined up by 8.55 am. Teachers will be outside to collect the children at 8:50 and will be available from 8:45 to talk to parents if needed. The children are expected to come into class independently. It is important that your child arrives on time, since our first lesson of the day will begin promptly at 9.00 a.m. If your child is absent from school, they must bring a note or parents must inform the teacher either in person or by telephone. Regular absences from school can affect your child's learning, since they will miss some vital work that has been planned. This will then mean that they will be working to 'catch up' when they return.

Children should line up at 8.55 am in the playground outside Key Stage 1 (or in the hall on rainy mornings). The children are to be collected from their classroom doors in the same area and will remain in class until their name is called by the class teacher. Children who are not collected will be taken to the school office.

Please inform the office if your child will be collected by another adult.

Clubs

The school run a range of before and after school clubs. Letters for clubs go out at the start of a half term and places are allocated on a first come first serve basis.



Holidays

Extended holidays are no longer permitted by law. Please make every effort to go away during the school holidays so that your child's schooling is not disrupted. Your child may be removed from the school roll if you do take an unauthorised absence.

Expectations



In Year 2, we expect every child to work towards achieving their full potential. The work will be set to match the children's varying abilities within the year group. Children are expected to try their best and behave appropriately in the classroom, the outdoor area and around the school, respecting both adults and other children.

Handwriting



The school uses cursive script handwriting scheme. This means that letters are consistently joined up.

Home Reading/Homework



The children will be given a reading book to read. **Books will be changed three times a week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday (Home learning policy).**

There is an expectation that the children read every night for at least 15 mins. Pupils in Year 2 will take home with them during a week, a book for pleasure reading and a scheme book or free reading book depending on their reading ability; reading records are checked daily. Homework goes home on Friday and focuses on number bonds, times tables, phonics and word recognition and writing. On Tuesday there is a 'homework help club', which takes place during morning break or at lunchtime.

Please comment about your child's reading in their reading booklet. It is crucial to sign in your child's reading record so the class teacher is aware that the child is reading daily at home.

In addition to their reading we would be grateful if you could help your child to learn high frequency words, letter names and sounds and numbers on a daily basis.

If you have any questions regarding the above, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher. Homework will be set on Google Classrooms.

Assessment



In Years 2 the children are continually assessed throughout the year. More thorough assessments will take place three times a year. We will share your child's progress with you on a termly basis at Parent's Evening.

SATS

All pupils in Year 2 will take part in the Key Stage 1 SATS. The KS1 SATS tests will assess the children's reading, writing and maths skills which they will have covered throughout the year in class. The assessments will be in May 2022. More information about this will be shared with parents once it is available to schools.

Phonics

The National phonics screening check is a statutory assessment that was introduced in 2012 to all Year 1 pupils and is a quick and easy check of your child's phonics knowledge. It comprises of a list of 40 words and nonsense words. It will assess phonics skills and knowledge learnt through reception and year 1. Children will read one-one with a teacher. Children will read up to 4 words per page and they will probably do the check in 10-15 minutes. They will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together. The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.



Uniform and P.E. Kit

It is school policy that all children wear uniform. This consists of white top, grey trousers or skirt/pinafore and the school jumper. We would encourage that your child wears school shoes. **Please ensure all items of clothing including shoes are labelled.** Children must not wear jewellery, however, studs are acceptable.

Physical Education (P.E.) is a compulsory part of the curriculum and important for the child's physical and social development. It is school policy that all children wear the correct P.E. kit in order to participate in P.E. activities safely. The kit consists of a white t-shirt, maroon shorts and plimsolls. **Year 2 Hazel Class pupils have PE on Tuesday and Friday. Year 2 Hawthorn Class have PE on Wednesday and Friday. Please ensure that your child comes to school in their PE kit on these days.**

Book bags

The children will need a Holywell book bag, which can be purchased from the office.



Dinner Money

Pupils in Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal under the universal free school meals scheme. All parents are required to register for this as it entitles the school to additional funding that could be spent on resources for learning.



Trips

The children will be going on school trips throughout the year, information will be shared nearer the time.

Parents Evening

Parent evenings take place three times a year. Teachers will be available throughout the year to discuss your child's progress on an individual basis.

Festival of Learning

Each half term children showcase their work where parents are invited to come to school. This also takes the form of Christmas Fete and Community Evenings, for which you will receive more information about at a later date.

Assemblies

Each class in the school takes part in a class assembly on a weekly basis. The parents of the class completing the assembly will be informed of when their child's assembly will take place and the parents are invited to come along to support their children.
